

METRO ROTARIANS ARE CHANGING LIVES

By refurbishing facilities:

Renovated the grounds and structures of Molokai's Mental Health Clubhouse, which assists adults struggling with mental illness or drug abuse, donating over \$130,000 in materials and labor; rebuilt a weakened structure, and provided a "facelift" to the kitchen and bathrooms at a Hale Kipa therapeutic group home for youth in Kalihi; and built raised-bed gardens, planted vegetables, herbs, fruit and flowering trees for women with children in recovery at Ka 'Olu Hou O Mānoa, a Salvation Army facility.

By giving gifts that give:

Donated over \$10,000 to provide food for young children from low-income families and provided volunteers at the Hawaii Food Bank warehouse to fill the keiki backpacks for the Princess Ka'iulani Food 4 Keiki Backpack Program; provided a Christmas dinner, trimmed trees and house decorations, and arranged a visit from Santa for the residents of Ka 'Olu Hou O Mānoa (a Salvation Army facility) and their families; provided dinners and entertainment to HUGS for families of children with serious illnesses; and donated school supplies for students at Princess Ka'iulani Elementary School, Kalihi Elementary School and The Salvation Army.

By reaching out in the world:

Contributions have made possible a computer lab at an elementary school in Mexico, water filtration systems in Rwanda and Thailand, books for 55 libraries and a hemodialysis machine for a health clinic in Thailand and improvements to a day care facility in Cebu, Philippines. Many of these projects have resulted in both sister-club and personal relationships where Metro members involved in these projects have been welcomed in host countries when they travel. The opportunities are limitless and the interactions with Rotarians around the world are truly valuable and inspiring.

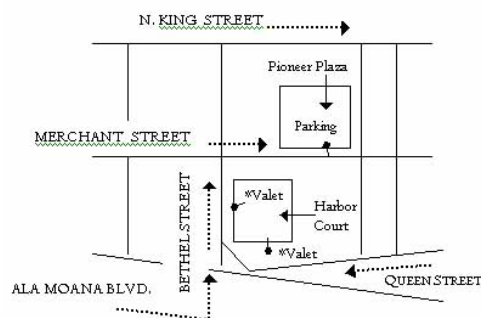

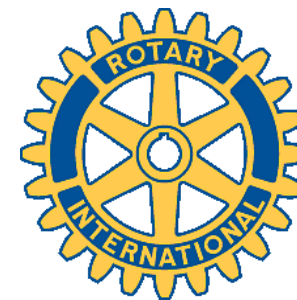

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL

Rotary International is the world's oldest service club, founded in 1905 by Chicago attorney Paul Harris. Rotary is an organization of business and professional leaders who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world. Today it consists of approximately 1.2 million Rotarians who are affiliated with one of the 31,000 Rotary Clubs in 167 countries.

ROTARY CLUB OF METROPOLITAN HONOLULU

There are 48 Rotary Clubs in Hawaii. The Rotary Club of Metropolitan Honolulu ("Metro Rotary") is the second largest with over 100 members (and growing!). Metro Rotary has received numerous awards for leadership in Rotary and in our local, national, and international community. However, Metro Rotary's greatest accomplishment is spreading the concept of "Service Above Self" to more and more people.

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

The Rotary Foundation funds Rotary International's major global initiatives, such as Polio Plus, which aims to eradicate polio from the world. To date, Rotary has raised over \$135 million for PolioPlus, and PolioPlus is 99% successful across the globe. Funds from the Foundation are also used to support projects for education and literacy, clean water, health and sanitation, disaster relief, and world peace.

METROPOLITAN HONOLULU ROTARY FOUNDATION

Providing scholarships, youth support, and educational support for all ages at home and abroad.

The Metropolitan Honolulu Rotary Foundation was formed by the Rotary Club of Metropolitan Honolulu and is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. Its purpose is....

- To provide scholarships and other learning experiences for youth,
- To educate youth and support programs for youth about healthy and responsible lifestyles,
- To educate individuals about all vocations available,
- To support programs concerned with the welfare of human beings of all kinds throughout the whole span of life and to support those in need,
- To support programs concerned with improving the Honolulu community as a place to live, including environmental matters,
- To support programs of an international scope consistent with the purposes above.
